1 Strike all after the enacting clause and insert the fol-  
2 lowing:

3 That the following sums are hereby appropriated, out of  
4 any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated,  
5 and out of applicable corporate or other revenues, receipts,  
6 and funds, for the several departments, agencies, corpora-  
7 tions, and other organizational units of Government for  
8 fiscal year 2011, and for other purposes, namely:

9 SEC. 101. Such amounts as may be necessary, at a  
10 rate for operations as provided in the applicable appro-  
11 priations Acts for fiscal year 2010 and under the authority  
12 and conditions provided in such Acts, for continuing

1 projects or activities (including the costs of direct loans  
2 and loan guarantees) that are not otherwise specifically  
3 provided for in this Act, that were conducted in fiscal year  
4 2010, and for which appropriations, funds, or other au-  
5 thority were made available in the following appropriations  
6 Acts:

7 (1) The Agriculture, Rural Development, Food  
8 and Drug Administration, and Related Agencies Ap-  
9 propriations Act, 2010 (Public Law 111–80).

10 (2) Division A of the Department of Defense  
11 Appropriations Act, 2010 (division A of Public Law  
12 111–118).

13 (3) The Energy and Water Development and  
14 Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2010 (Public  
15 Law 111–85).

16 (4) The Department of Homeland Security Ap-  
17 propriations Act, 2010 (Public Law 111–83) and  
18 section 601 of the Supplemental Appropriations Act,  
19 2010 (Public Law 111–212).

20 (5) The Department of the Interior, Environ-  
21 ment, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act,  
22 2010 (division A of Public Law 111–88).

23 (6) The Legislative Branch Appropriations Act,  
24 2010 (division A of Public Law 111–68).

1           (7) The Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2010  
2           (Public Law 111–117).

3           (8) Chapter 3 of title I of the Supplemental Ap-  
4           propriations Act, 2010 (Public Law 111–212), ex-  
5           cept for appropriations under the heading “Oper-  
6           ation and Maintenance” relating to Haiti following  
7           the earthquake of January 12, 2010, or the Port of  
8           Guam: *Provided*, That the amount provided for the  
9           Department of Defense pursuant to this paragraph  
10          shall not exceed a rate for operations of  
11          \$29,387,401,000: *Provided further*, That the Sec-  
12          retary of Defense shall allocate such amount to each  
13          appropriation account, budget activity, activity  
14          group, and subactivity group, and to each program,  
15          project, and activity within each appropriation ac-  
16          count, in the same proportions as such appropria-  
17          tions for fiscal year 2010.

18          (9) Section 102(c) of chapter 1 of title I of the  
19          Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2010 (Public Law  
20          111–212) that addresses guaranteed loans in the  
21          rural housing insurance fund.

22          (10) The appropriation under the heading “De-  
23          partment of Commerce—United States Patent and  
24          Trademark Office” in the United States Patent and

1 Trademark Office Supplemental Appropriations Act,  
2 2010 (Public Law 111–224).

3 SEC. 102. (a) No appropriation or funds made avail-  
4 able or authority granted pursuant to section 101 for the  
5 Department of Defense shall be used for (1) the new pro-  
6 duction of items not funded for production in fiscal year  
7 2010 or prior years; (2) the increase in production rates  
8 above those sustained with fiscal year 2010 funds; or (3)  
9 the initiation, resumption, or continuation of any project,  
10 activity, operation, or organization (defined as any project,  
11 subproject, activity, budget activity, program element, and  
12 subprogram within a program element, and for any invest-  
13 ment items defined as a P–1 line item in a budget activity  
14 within an appropriation account and an R–1 line item that  
15 includes a program element and subprogram element with-  
16 in an appropriation account) for which appropriations,  
17 funds, or other authority were not available during fiscal  
18 year 2010.

19 (b) No appropriation or funds made available or au-  
20 thority granted pursuant to section 101 for the Depart-  
21 ment of Defense shall be used to initiate multi-year pro-  
22 curements utilizing advance procurement funding for eco-  
23 nomic order quantity procurement unless specifically ap-  
24 propriated later.

1       SEC. 103. Appropriations made by section 101 shall  
2 be available to the extent and in the manner that would  
3 be provided by the pertinent appropriations Act.

4       SEC. 104. Except as otherwise provided in section  
5 102, no appropriation or funds made available or author-  
6 ity granted pursuant to section 101 shall be used to ini-  
7 tiate or resume any project or activity for which appro-  
8 priations, funds, or other authority were not available dur-  
9 ing fiscal year 2010.

10       SEC. 105. Appropriations made and authority grant-  
11 ed pursuant to this Act shall cover all obligations or ex-  
12 penditures incurred for any project or activity during the  
13 period for which funds or authority for such project or  
14 activity are available under this Act.

15       SEC. 106. Unless otherwise provided for in this Act  
16 or in the applicable appropriations Act for fiscal year  
17 2011, appropriations and funds made available and au-  
18 thority granted pursuant to this Act shall be available  
19 until whichever of the following first occurs: (1) the enact-  
20 ment into law of an appropriation for any project or activ-  
21 ity provided for in this Act; (2) the enactment into law  
22 of the applicable appropriations Act for fiscal year 2011  
23 without any provision for such project or activity; or (3)  
24 December 3, 2010.

1       SEC. 107. Expenditures made pursuant to this Act  
2 shall be charged to the applicable appropriation, fund, or  
3 authorization whenever a bill in which such applicable ap-  
4 propriation, fund, or authorization is contained is enacted  
5 into law.

6       SEC. 108. Appropriations made and funds made  
7 available by or authority granted pursuant to this Act may  
8 be used without regard to the time limitations for submis-  
9 sion and approval of apportionments set forth in section  
10 1513 of title 31, United States Code, but nothing in this  
11 Act may be construed to waive any other provision of law  
12 governing the apportionment of funds.

13       SEC. 109. Notwithstanding any other provision of  
14 this Act, except section 106, for those programs that  
15 would otherwise have high initial rates of operation or  
16 complete distribution of appropriations at the beginning  
17 of fiscal year 2011 because of distributions of funding to  
18 States, foreign countries, grantees, or others, such high  
19 initial rates of operation or complete distribution shall not  
20 be made, and no grants shall be awarded for such pro-  
21 grams funded by this Act that would impinge on final  
22 funding prerogatives.

23       SEC. 110. This Act shall be implemented so that only  
24 the most limited funding action of that permitted in the

1 Act shall be taken in order to provide for continuation of  
2 projects and activities.

3 SEC. 111. (a) For entitlements and other mandatory  
4 payments whose budget authority was provided in appro-  
5 priations Acts for fiscal year 2010, and for activities under  
6 the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008, activities shall be  
7 continued at the rate to maintain program levels under  
8 current law, under the authority and conditions provided  
9 in the applicable appropriations Act for fiscal year 2010,  
10 to be continued through the date specified in section  
11 106(3).

12 (b) Notwithstanding section 106, obligations for man-  
13 datory payments due on or about the first day of any  
14 month that begins after October 2010 but not later than  
15 30 days after the date specified in section 106(3) may con-  
16 tinue to be made, and funds shall be available for such  
17 payments.

18 SEC. 112. Amounts made available under section 101  
19 for civilian personnel compensation and benefits in each  
20 department and agency may be apportioned up to the rate  
21 for operations necessary to avoid furloughs within such de-  
22 partment or agency, consistent with the applicable appro-  
23 priations Act for fiscal year 2010, except that such author-  
24 ity provided under this section shall not be used until after  
25 the department or agency has taken all necessary actions

1 to reduce or defer non-personnel-related administrative ex-  
2 penses.

3 SEC. 113. Funds appropriated by this Act may be  
4 obligated and expended notwithstanding section 10 of  
5 Public Law 91–672 (22 U.S.C. 2412), section 15 of the  
6 State Department Basic Authorities Act of 1956 (22  
7 U.S.C. 2680), section 313 of the Foreign Relations Au-  
8 thorization Act, Fiscal Years 1994 and 1995 (22 U.S.C.  
9 6212), and section 504(a)(1) of the National Security Act  
10 of 1947 (50 U.S.C. 414(a)(1)).

11 SEC. 114. The following amounts are designated as  
12 an emergency requirement and necessary to meet emer-  
13 gency needs pursuant to sections 403(a) and 423(b) of  
14 S. Con. Res. 13 (111th Congress), the concurrent resolu-  
15 tion on the budget for fiscal year 2010:

16 (1) Amounts incorporated by reference in this  
17 Act that were previously designated as available for  
18 overseas deployments and other activities pursuant  
19 to such concurrent resolution.

20 (2) Amounts made available pursuant to para-  
21 graph (8) of section 101 of this Act.

22 SEC. 115. Notwithstanding any other provision of  
23 this Act, funds appropriated under the heading “Food for  
24 Peace Title II Grants” in chapter 1 of title I of the Sup-  
25 plemental Appropriations Act, 2010 (Public Law 111–

1 212) may be used to reimburse obligations incurred for  
2 the purposes provided therein prior to the enactment of  
3 such Act.

4 SEC. 116. The authority provided by section 18(h)(5)  
5 of the Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act (42  
6 U.S.C. 1769(h)(5)) shall continue in effect through the  
7 earlier of the date of enactment of an authorization Act  
8 related to the Richard B. Russell National School Lunch  
9 Act or the date specified in section 106(3) of this Act.

10 SEC. 117. Notwithstanding section 101, amounts are  
11 provided for “Department of Commerce—Bureau of the  
12 Census—Periodic Censuses and Programs”, for necessary  
13 expenses to collect and publish statistics for periodic cen-  
14 suses and programs provided for by law, at a rate for oper-  
15 ations of \$964,315,000.

16 SEC. 118. The authority provided by section 1202 of  
17 the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year  
18 2006 (Public Law 109–163), as most recently amended  
19 by section 1222 of the National Defense Authorization Act  
20 for Fiscal Year 2010 (Public Law 111–84; 123 Stat.  
21 2518), shall continue in effect through the date specified  
22 in section 106(3) of this Act.

23 SEC. 119. Notwithstanding subsection (b) of section  
24 310 of the Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2009 (Public  
25 Law 111–32; 123 Stat. 1870), a claim described in that

1 subsection that is submitted before the date specified in  
2 section 106(3) of this Act shall be treated as a claim for  
3 which payment may be made under such section 310.

4       SEC. 120. (a) RESCISSION.—The unobligated balance  
5 of authority provided for investigations under the heading  
6 “Department of Defense—Civil, Department of the Army,  
7 Corps of Engineers—Civil”, investigations, in chapter 4  
8 of title I of the Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2010  
9 (Public Law 111–212; 124 Stat. 2312) is rescinded as of  
10 the date of enactment of this Act.

11       (b) APPROPRIATION.—Notwithstanding any other  
12 provision in this Act—

13           (1) there is appropriated to the Department of  
14 the Army, Corps of Engineers, an amount equal to  
15 the unobligated balance rescinded by subsection (a),  
16 to remain available until expended, for investiga-  
17 tions;

18           (2) that such amount be available on the date  
19 of enactment of this Act; and

20           (3) the amount is designated as an emergency  
21 requirement and necessary to meet emergency needs  
22 pursuant to sections 403(a) and 423(b) of S. Con.  
23 Res. 13 (111th Congress), the concurrent resolution  
24 on the budget for fiscal year 2010.

1       SEC. 121. (a) RESCISSION.—The unobligated balance  
2 of authority provided for in section 401 of chapter 4 of  
3 title I of the Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2010  
4 (Public Law 111–212; 124 Stat. 2313) for drought emer-  
5 gency assistance is rescinded as of the date of enactment  
6 of this Act.

7       (b) APPROPRIATION.—Notwithstanding any other  
8 provision in this Act—

9           (1) there is appropriated to the Bureau of Rec-  
10 lamation, an amount equal to the unobligated bal-  
11 ance rescinded by subsection (a), to remain available  
12 until expended, for drought emergency assistance:  
13 *Provided*, That financial assistance may be provided  
14 under the Reclamation States Emergency Drought  
15 Relief Act of 1991 (43 U.S.C. 2201 et seq.) and any  
16 other applicable Federal law (including regulations)  
17 for the optimization and conservation of project  
18 water supplies to assist drought-plagued areas of the  
19 West;

20           (2) that such amount be available on the date  
21 of enactment of this Act; and

22           (3) the amount is designated as an emergency  
23 requirement and necessary to meet emergency needs  
24 pursuant to sections 403(a) and 423(b) of S. Con.

1       Res. 13 (111th Congress), the concurrent resolution  
2       on the budget for fiscal year 2010.

3       SEC. 122. Notwithstanding any other provision of  
4 this Act, except section 106, the District of Columbia may  
5 expend local funds for programs and activities under the  
6 heading “District of Columbia Funds” for such programs  
7 and activities under title IV of S. 3677 (111th Congress),  
8 as reported by the Committee on Appropriations of the  
9 Senate, at the rate set forth under “District of Columbia  
10 Funds” as included in the Fiscal Year 2011 Budget Re-  
11 quest Act (D.C. Act 18–448), as modified as of the date  
12 of the enactment of this Act.

13       SEC. 123. Section 550(b) of Public Law 109–295, as  
14 amended by section 550 of Public Law 111–83, shall be  
15 applied by substituting the date specified in section 106(3)  
16 of this Act for “October 4, 2010”.

17       SEC. 124. Section 203(m) of the Robert T. Stafford  
18 Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C.  
19 5133(m)) shall be applied by substituting the date speci-  
20 fied in section 106(3) of this Act for “September 30,  
21 2010”.

22       SEC. 125. Any funds made available pursuant to sec-  
23 tion 101 for the Federal Air Marshals may be obligated  
24 at a rate for operations not exceeding that necessary to

1 sustain domestic and international flight coverage at the  
2 same level as the final quarter of fiscal year 2010.

3       SEC. 126. Any funds made available pursuant to sec-  
4 tion 101 for U.S. Customs and Border Protection may be  
5 obligated at a rate for operations not exceeding that nec-  
6 essary to sustain the numbers of personnel in place in the  
7 final quarter of fiscal year 2010. The Commissioner of  
8 U.S. Customs and Border Protection shall notify the Com-  
9 mittees on Appropriations of the House of Representatives  
10 and the Senate on each use of the authority provided in  
11 this section.

12       SEC. 127. Notwithstanding section 101, amounts are  
13 provided for “Department of the Interior—Minerals Man-  
14 agement Service—Royalty and Offshore Minerals Man-  
15 agement” at a rate for operations of \$365,000,000: *Pro-*  
16 *vided*, That amounts provided herein from the general  
17 fund shall be reduced in an amount not to exceed  
18 \$154,890,000, as receipts from increases to rates in effect  
19 on August 5, 1993, and from cost recovery fees are re-  
20 ceived: *Provided further*, That of the prior-year unobli-  
21 gated balances available for “Department of the Inte-  
22 rior—Minerals Management Service—Royalty and Off-  
23 shore Minerals Management”, \$25,000,000 are rescinded.

1           SEC. 128. Section 2(e)(1)(B) of Public Law 109–129  
2 shall be applied by substituting the date specified in sec-  
3 tion 106(3) of this Act for “September 30, 2010”.

4           SEC. 129. From funds transferred to “Department  
5 of Health and Human Services—Office of the Secretary—  
6 Public Health and Social Services Emergency Fund” by  
7 Public Law 111–117 in the fourth paragraph under such  
8 heading, amounts shall be available through the date spec-  
9 ified in section 106(3) of this Act to support advanced  
10 research and development pursuant to section 319L of the  
11 Public Health Service Act, at a rate for operations of  
12 \$305,000,000.

13           SEC. 130. (a) EXTENSION OF THE TEMPORARY AS-  
14 SISTANCE FOR NEEDY FAMILIES PROGRAM.—Activities  
15 authorized by part A of title IV and section 1108(b) of  
16 the Social Security Act (other than the Emergency Contin-  
17 gency Fund for State Temporary Assistance for Needy  
18 Families Programs established under subsection (c) of sec-  
19 tion 403 of such Act) shall continue through the date spec-  
20 ified in section 106(3) of this Act in the manner author-  
21 ized for fiscal year 2010, subject to the amendments made  
22 by subsection (b) of this section, and out of any money  
23 in the Treasury of the United States not otherwise appro-  
24 priated, there are hereby appropriated such sums as may  
25 be necessary for such purpose. Grants and payments may

1 be made pursuant to this authority through the applicable  
2 portion of the first quarter of fiscal year 2011 at the pro  
3 rata portion of the level provided for such activities  
4 through the first quarter of fiscal year 2010.

5 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.—

6 (1) SUPPLEMENTAL GRANTS FOR POPULATION  
7 INCREASES.—Section 403(a)(3)(H)(ii) of the Social  
8 Security Act (42 U.S.C. 603(a)(3)(H)(ii)) is amend-  
9 ed to read as follows:

10 “(ii) subparagraph (G) shall be ap-  
11 plied as if ‘the date specified in section  
12 106(3) of the Continuing Appropriations  
13 Act, 2011’ were substituted for ‘fiscal year  
14 2001’; and”.

15 (2) CONTINGENCY FUND.—

16 (A) DEPOSIT INTO FUND.—Section  
17 403(b)(2) of such Act (42 U.S.C. 603(b)(2)) is  
18 amended—

19 (i) by striking “fiscal years 1997” and  
20 all that follows through “2003” and insert-  
21 ing “fiscal years 2011 and 2012”; and

22 (ii) by striking “\$2,000,000,000” and  
23 inserting “, in the case of fiscal year 2011,  
24 \$506,000,000 and in the case of fiscal year  
25 2012, \$612,000,000”.

1 (B) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—Section  
2 403(b)(3)(C)(ii) of such Act (42 U.S.C.  
3 603(b)(3)(C)(ii)) is amended by striking “fiscal  
4 years 1997 through 2010 shall not exceed the  
5 total amount appropriated pursuant to para-  
6 graph (2)” and inserting “fiscal year 2011 and  
7 2012, respectively, shall not exceed the total  
8 amount appropriated pursuant to paragraph (2)  
9 for each such fiscal year”.

10 (3) MAINTENANCE OF EFFORT.—Section  
11 409(a)(7) of such Act (42 U.S.C. 609(a)(7)) is  
12 amended—

13 (A) in subparagraph (A), by striking “or  
14 2011” and inserting “2011, or 2012”; and

15 (B) in subparagraph (B)(ii), by striking  
16 “2010” and inserting “2011”.

17 SEC. 131. Activities authorized by section 429 of the  
18 Social Security Act shall continue through September 30,  
19 2011, in the manner authorized for fiscal year 2010, and  
20 out of any money in the Treasury of the United States  
21 not otherwise appropriated, there are hereby appropriated  
22 such sums as may be necessary for such purpose. Grants  
23 and payments may be made pursuant to this authority on  
24 a quarterly basis through fiscal year 2011 at the level pro-

1 vided for such activities for the corresponding quarter of  
2 fiscal year 2010.

3 SEC. 132. Effective October 1, 2010, subpart 2 of  
4 part B of title IV of the Social Security Act is amended—

5 (1) in section 436 (42 U.S.C. 629f)—

6 (A) in subsection (a)—

7 (i) by striking “2011” and inserting  
8 “2010”; and

9 (ii) by inserting before the period the  
10 following: “, and \$365,000,000 for fiscal  
11 year 2011”; and

12 (B) by striking “\$10,000,000” in sub-  
13 section (b)(2) and inserting “\$30,000,000”;  
14 and

15 (2) in section 438 (42 U.S.C. 629h)—

16 (A) by striking “2010” in subsection  
17 (c)(2)(A) and inserting “2011”; and

18 (B) by adding at the end of subsection (e)  
19 the following flush sentence: “For fiscal year  
20 2011, out of the amount reserved pursuant to  
21 section 436(b)(2) for such fiscal year, there are  
22 available \$10,000,000 for grants referred to in  
23 subsection (b)(2)(B), and \$10,000,000 for  
24 grants referred to in subsection (b)(2)(C).”.

1       SEC. 133. Notwithstanding any other provision of  
2 this Act, for payment in equal shares to the following chil-  
3 dren and grandchildren of Robert C. Byrd, late a Senator  
4 from West Virginia: Mona Byrd Fatemi, Erik Byrd  
5 Fatemi, Darius James Fatemi, Fredrick Kurosh Fatemi,  
6 Marjorie Moore, Mona Byrd Pearson, and Mary Ann  
7 Clarkson, \$193,400 is appropriated.

8       SEC. 134. Notwithstanding section 101, amounts are  
9 provided for deposit into “Department of Defense Base  
10 Closure Account 2005” at a rate for operations of  
11 \$2,354,285,000.

12       SEC. 135. Notwithstanding section 101, amounts are  
13 provided for “Department of State—Administration of  
14 Foreign Affairs—Diplomatic and Consular Programs” at  
15 a rate for operations of \$8,601,000,000.

16       SEC. 136. Notwithstanding section 101, amounts are  
17 provided for “International Security Assistance—Funds  
18 Appropriated to the President—Foreign Military Financ-  
19 ing Program” at a rate for operations of \$5,160,000,000,  
20 of which not less than \$2,775,000,000 shall be available  
21 for grants only for Israel, not less than \$1,300,000,000  
22 shall be available for grants only for Egypt, and not less  
23 than \$300,000,000 shall be available for assistance for  
24 Jordan: *Provided*, That the dollar amount in the fourth

1 proviso under such heading in title IV of division F of  
2 Public Law 111–117 shall be deemed to be \$729,825,000.

3 SEC. 137. (a) Notwithstanding section 101, amounts  
4 are provided for “International Security Assistance—  
5 Funds Appropriated to the President—Pakistan Counter-  
6 insurgency Capability Fund” at a rate for operations of  
7 \$700,000,000.

8 (b) Amounts provided by subsection (a) shall be avail-  
9 able to the Secretary of State under the terms and condi-  
10 tions provided for this Fund in Public Law 111–32 and  
11 Public Law 111–212 through the date specified in section  
12 106(3) of this Act.

13 SEC. 138. Section 1(b)(2) of the Passport Act of  
14 June 4, 1920 (22 U.S.C. 214(b)(2)) shall be applied by  
15 substituting the date specified in section 106(3) of this  
16 Act for “September 30, 2010”.

17 SEC. 139. (a) Section 1115(d) of Public Law 111–  
18 32 shall be applied by substituting the date specified in  
19 section 106(3) of this Act for “October 1, 2010”.

20 (b) Section 824(g) of the Foreign Service Act of 1980  
21 (22 U.S.C. 4064(g)) shall be applied by substituting the  
22 date specified in section 106(3) of this Act for “October  
23 1, 2010” in paragraph (2).

24 (c) Section 61(a) of the State Department Basic Au-  
25 thorities Act of 1956 (22 U.S.C. 2733(a)) shall be applied

1 by substituting the date specified in section 106(3) of this  
2 Act for “October 1, 2010” in paragraph (2).

3 (d) Section 625(j)(1) of the Foreign Assistance Act  
4 of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2385(j)(1)) shall be applied by sub-  
5 stituting the date specified in section 106(3) of this Act  
6 for “October 1, 2010” in subparagraph (B).

7 SEC. 140. The authority provided by section 1334 of  
8 the Foreign Affairs Reform and Restructuring Act of  
9 1998 (22 U.S.C. 6553) shall remain in effect through the  
10 date specified in section 106(3) of this Act.

11 SEC. 141. Commitments to guarantee loans incurred  
12 under the General and Special Risk Insurance Funds, as  
13 authorized by sections 238 and 519 of the National Hous-  
14 ing Act (12 U.S.C. 1715z–3 and 1735c), shall not exceed  
15 a rate for operations of \$20,000,000,000: *Provided*, That  
16 total loan principal, any part of which is to be guaranteed,  
17 may be apportioned through the date specified in section  
18 106(3) of this Act, at \$80,000,000 multiplied by the num-  
19 ber of days covered by this Act.

20 SEC. 142. The provisions of title II of the McKinney-  
21 Vento Homeless Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 11311 et seq.)  
22 shall continue in effect, notwithstanding section 209 of  
23 such Act, through the earlier of: (1) the date specified in  
24 section 106(3) of this Act; or (2) the date of the enact-

1 ment into law of an authorization Act relating to the  
2 McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act.

3       SEC. 143. Notwithstanding any other provision of law  
4 or of this Act, for mortgages for which the mortgagee  
5 issues credit approval for the borrower during fiscal year  
6 2011, the second sentence of section 255(g) of the Na-  
7 tional Housing Act (12 U.S.C. 1715z-20(g)) shall be con-  
8 sidered to require that in no case may the benefits of in-  
9 surance under such section 255 exceed 150 percent of the  
10 maximum dollar amount in effect under the sixth sentence

8 if the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development de-  
9 termines, for any geographic area that is smaller than an  
10 area for which dollar amount limitations on the principal  
11 obligation of a mortgage are determined under section  
12 203(b)(2) of the National Housing Act, that a higher such  
13 maximum dollar amount limitation is warranted for any  
14 particular size or sizes of residences in such sub-area by  
15 higher median home prices in such sub-area, the Secretary

4 Home Loan Mortgage Corporation determined under sec-  
5 tion 302(b)(2) of the Federal National Mortgage Associa-

7 305(a)(2) of the Federal Home Loan Mortgage Corpora-

19 (b) DISCRETIONARY AUTHORITY FOR SUB-AREAS.—

21 if the Director of the Federal Housing Finance Agency  
22 determines, for any geographic area that is smaller than  
23 an area for which limitations on the maximum original  
24 principal obligation of a mortgage are determined for the  
25 Federal National Mortgage Association or the Federal
