Clinical Trial Finder Mobile Application

The Fight Colorectal Cancer (Fight CRC) Late Stage Microsatellite Stable (MSS) CRC Clinical Trial Finder mobile application launched on April 18th, 2019.

The mobile application is the cumulative efforts of the late Dr. Tom Marsilje, a stage IV colorectal cancer survivor scientist, Flatiron Health, and Fight Colorectal Cancer.

History of the trial finder

The Late Stage MSS CRC Clinical Trial Finder was developed in 2017 after Dr. Tom saw the need to create a list of clinical trials for patients with MSS colorectal cancer. With current immunotherapy approaches, MSS tumors have not had the same favorable responses as microsatellite instable (MSI) tumors, therefore research continues to study ways to effectively treat MSS tumors for patients with this biomarker.

The trial finder provides a curated list of potential clinical trials for patients and caregivers to discuss with their medical team. The tool is updated each day and monitored by Fight CRC research advocates.

Recognizing the need to provide a version of the trial finder for patients on the go, Fight CRC worked with Flatiron Health to develop the trial finder mobile application.

How do I download the app?

To download the app, go to the App Store (if you have an iPhone) or the Google Play app store (for Android). To find the app, use the search bar to type in "Fight CRC Trial Finder". From there, you will be able to download the Fight CRC Late Stage MSS CRC Trial Finder mobile app onto your personal device.



You can also point your phone camera at this code and it will direct you to the app on the store!

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Using the mobile application

Upon opening the application, you will be asked four questions which include:

1. Do you know your MSI or MSS status?

If you do not know whether you are MSI or MSS, talk to your doctor. It's very important to know your status before making treatment decisions. Currently this trial finder is only for late stage MSS patients.

2. Are you only interested in Immunotherapy?

CRC patients with MSI-H tumors have shown to be receptive to IO treatments. Now clinical trials are investigating immunotherapy options for MSS tumors. If you select you're only interested in IO, you will only be shown IO trials. You can change these settings later in the filters section.

3. Have you had immunotherapy before?

There are varying reasons why certain trials exclude patients who've previously had specific treatments such as immunotherapy. However, new trial designs are allowing more patients who've had prior immunotherapy to enroll. By selecting yes, you will only be shown trials that do not exclude individuals who have had immunotherapy in the past. Selecting no on this question will show you all trials regardless of this exclusion criteria. These settings can be edited later in the filter page.

4. Location preferences

This question allows you to limit your search to specific geographical areas. Selecting a certain location will only show trials located in the selected state or country in the search results list. Users however also have the ability to show trials that fit the previous criteria outside of selected locations. The search results will still prioritize selected locations at the top of the list, but will also show trials that fit the previous criteria in other locations.

Over 50% of trial finder users are conducting searches on their phones. This application is designed to facilitate the search of clinical trials on mobile devices. This application also makes it easier for users to search and discuss trials with their oncologists in real time at their appointments.
