Fight CRC informs and influences the research community to commit more resources to colorectal cancer research, including potential breakthrough projects that lead to increased screening and better outcomes.

Research advocates bring the patient viewpoint to the research process, communicating a collective patient perspective. Research advocates include cancer survivors, caregivers and champions. Fight Colorectal Cancer's Research Advocacy Training and Support (RATS) program trains colorectal cancer advocates to become the most educated patient voice at the research table. Through this program, participants learn all about colorectal cancer research, from prevention and cancer biology to treatment, survivorship, and palliative care.

## **About the Research Advocates**

The RATS program has over a dozen active members who are engaged through learning labs and additional education opportunities. The majority are patients and survivors. Research Advocates are located throughout the country, representing 10 states.

### **Engagement**

Nearly 90% of current research advocates have attended a RATS Academy, and almost all regularly engage in advocacy efforts and/ or seek novel ways to contribute the patient voice to research.

- Speak at meetings/conferences for accredited institutions to share a patient perspective
- Inform best practices for university cancer center program development
- \* Serve as advocate reviewers for grants and/or journal articles
- \* Serve as consumer reviews with the Peer-Reviewed Cancer Research Program (PRCRP) through the Department of Defense (DOD) Congressionally-Directed Medical Research Program (CDMRP)
- Participate in Local Institutional Review Boards (IRBs)
- Attend large cancer research conferences representing patient research advocacy (ASCO, ASCO GI, etc.)
