

WHAT'S ARKANSAS DOING ABOUT COLORECTAL CANCER? In April 2021, Governor Asa Hutchinson signed into law a bill lowering the colorectal cancer screening age to 45 for those at average risk and removed out of pocket costs for patients needing a colonoscopy after an abnormal non-invasive screening test.



WHAT'S CALIFORNIA DOING ABOUT COLORECTAL CANCER? In October 2021, Governor Gavin Newsom signed a bill into law to remove out of pocket costs for Californians needing a colonoscopy after an abnormal non-invasive screening test. Californias gained coverage for the full spectrum of colorectal cancer screening, including the necessary colonoscopy following an abnormal non-invasive screening test.

In addition, Fight CRC Catalyst grantees in California successfully worked to get colorectal cancer screening added as a quality measure for the Centers for Medicaid and Medicare Services (CMS) Adult Core Set. This means that more states will now measure colorectal cancer screening rates in their Medicaid program. This is important because as the saying goes, "what gets measured, gets improved."





WHAT'S INDIANA DOING ABOUT COLORECTAL CANCER? In March 2022, Governor Eric Holcomb signed into law legislation that eliminated cost sharing for all colorectal cancer screening including colonoscopy following an abnormal non-invasive screening test. This built on a law that was passed in 2020 that required insurance companies to cover colonoscopies at age 45 instead of the previously recommended 50.

WHAT'S DOING ABOUT COLORECTAL CANCER? In 2021, Kentucky became the first state to adopt a pharmacy protocol that allows pharmacists to produce colorectal cancer education, and when appropriate, initiative non-invasive colorectal cancer screening. This means some patients could be taking care of their colorectal cancer screening at their local CVS, Walgreens, or independent pharmacy—the same place they go for a flu shot or regular prescriptions.

Catalyst grantees in Kentucky also successfully worked to codify access to colorectal cancer screening and genetic testing in Kentucky's Medicaid program.

In February 2023, Governor Phil Murphy signed into law a bill that required health insurers to cover colorectal cancer screenings recommended by the United States Preventive Services Task Force (USPSTF) and eliminate cost-sharing for required follow-up colonoscopies after an abnormal non-invasive screening test with the goal of improving screening rates across New Jersey.
