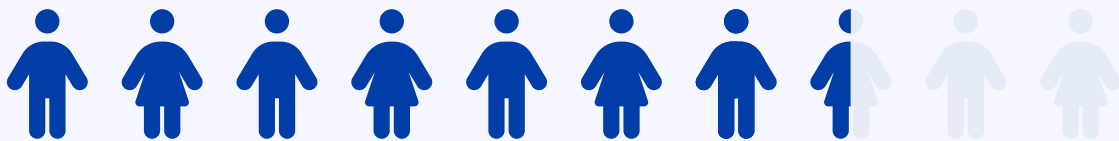

WHAT'S INDIANA DOING ABOUT COLORECTAL CANCER? In March 2022, Governor Eric Holcomb signed into law legislation that eliminated cost sharing for all colorectal cancer screening including colonoscopy following an abnormal non-invasive screening test. This built on a law that was passed in 2020 that required insurance companies to cover colonoscopies at age 45 instead of the previously recommended 50.
