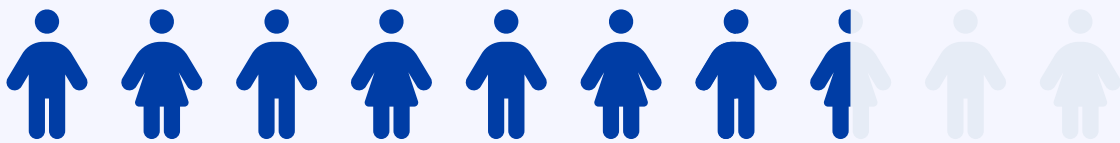

★ **WHAT'S NEW YORK DOING ABOUT COLORECTAL CANCER?** In December 2022, Governor Kathy Hochul signed into law a bill to help ensure colorectal cancer screening coverage for New Yorkers at average-risk starting at age 45, and ensure that state regulated insurance plans cover, with no cost-sharing, follow-up colonoscopies after an abnormal non-invasive stool test.
